



Campaign to End Loneliness welcomes NHS England statement on loneliness

Laura Alcock-Ferguson, Executive Director of the Campaign to End Loneliness, said:

"We welcome Professor Jane Cummings' statement today. As we have long known, loneliness can have devastating health impacts, and the combination of loneliness and winter is highly dangerous for older people.

"We must also remember that loneliness is not the sole responsibility of the NHS to address. We can all play a part in tackling it. As a proud member of the Jo Cox Commission on loneliness, we look forward to the launch of the Commission report on Friday. The report will again shed light on our responsibility as a society to tackle this chronic and widespread issue.
